

Romans 3:19-28

Now we know that whatever the law says, it says to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced and the whole world held accountable to God. Therefore no one will be declared righteous in his sight by observing the law; rather, through the law we become conscious of sin. But now a righteousness from God, apart from law, has been made known, to which the Law and the Prophets testify. This righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference, for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. God presented him as a sacrifice of atonement, through faith in his blood. He did this to demonstrate his justice, because in his forbearance he had left the sins committed beforehand unpunished—he did it to demonstrate his justice at the present time, so as to be just and the one who justifies those who have faith in Jesus. Where, then, is boasting? It is excluded. On what principle? On that of observing the law? No, but on that of faith. For we maintain that a man is justified by faith apart from observing the law.

A SAFE, CONVENIENT WAY TO DONATE!

Pleasant Hills Community Presbyterian Church has a more reliable way for you to fulfill your pledge commitment in 2011: DIRECT DEPOSIT! Quite a few church members have already adopted this method. Weekly and monthly pledges can be simplified without sacrificing personal control. Below is a list of questions and answers that may address issues you may have regarding Direct Deposit.

What is Direct Deposit? Direct Deposit is a way of transferring funds from one bank account to another electronically. In this case, money moves from an account specified by you, usually either a savings or checking account, to our Church bank account.

What are the advantages of choosing Direct Deposit? Direct Deposit is reliable and very convenient. You will always know that your pledge amounts are up to date. Direct Deposit is also very safe. It eliminates the possibility of a lost or stolen check. Direct Deposit will save you time by eliminating the need to grab your checkbook, write a check, find your envelope and possibly find a stamp.

How do I sign up for Direct Deposit? You can sign up for Direct Deposit by completing the attached page and returning it to the Business Office at the Church or including it in your next donation envelope.

After I sign up for Direct Deposit, when will the first automatic deduction take effect? It usually takes two periods (either weekly or monthly, depending on what prefer) for the automatic deduction to take effect. The first period is used to verify your account number and your routing number.

How will I know that the funds have been withdrawn from my account? For details regarding your direct deposit, please contact your bank. Your bank should be able to provide you with this information.

Can I still donate or pledge using a check or cash? Yes, if you wish to make a donation in addition to your weekly or monthly pledge amount, you are still able to donate using a check or cash.

Do I have to sign up for Direct Deposit every year? No. You need only to sign up for Direct Deposit once.

What if I want to change the bank account that I use? You should ask the Business Office for a new Direct Deposit form, so we can change your bank information.

What will happen if I forget to notify the Church that I have changed my account? Our Direct Deposit transaction will be rejected by your bank and we will notify you by letter or a phone call. At that point, we can update your bank account information for your Direct Deposit.

What if I want to cancel my Direct Deposit? Please notify the Business Office and let us know that you would like to cancel your Direct Deposit.

If you are interested in starting this reliable method of pledging, we have included a form for you to complete and return to Business Office at your convenience. If you have any questions, please contact either of us!
