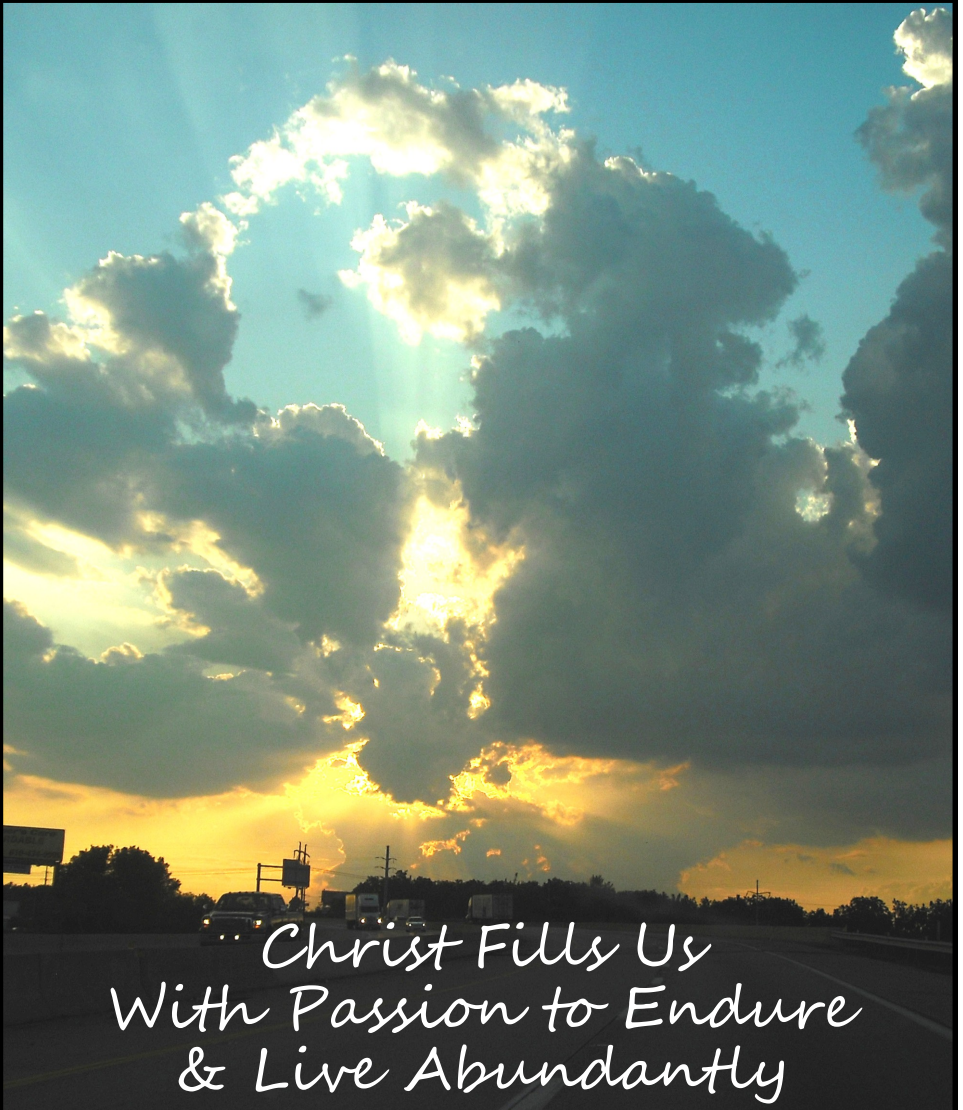

The Parables of the Mustard Seed and the Yeast

He told them another parable: “The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed, which a man took and planted in his field. Though it is the smallest of all seeds, yet when it grows, it is the largest of garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds come and perch in its branches.” He told them still another parable: “The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed into about sixty pounds of flour until it worked all through the dough.”

The Parables of the Hidden Treasure and the Pearl

“The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field. When a man found it, he hid it again, and then in his joy went and sold all he had and bought that field. “Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls. When he found one of great value, he went away and sold everything he had and bought it.

The Parable of the Net

“Once again, the kingdom of heaven is like a net that was let down into the lake and caught all kinds of fish. When it was full, the fishermen pulled it up on the shore. Then they sat down and collected the good fish in baskets, but threw the bad away. This is how it will be at the end of the age. The angels will come and separate the wicked from the righteous and throw them into the blazing furnace, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. “Have you understood all these things?” Jesus asked. “Yes,” they replied. He said to them, “Therefore every teacher of the law who has become a disciple in the kingdom of heaven is like the owner of a house who brings out of his storeroom new treasures as well as old.

The descriptions used in these parables go from one extreme to the other. How can we seek the kingdom in both our mustard seed and hidden treasure moments?

Did You Know?

God loves you and wants you to know Him. In one of the books of the Bible, we are told *For God so loved the world that He gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him, shall not perish but have eternal life.*” —John 3:16

But there is a problem. We humans are messed up. We hurt ourselves, those around us and are separated from God and don't have a relationship with Him or even realize He loves us. Another book of the Bible, Romans, says *“For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.”*—Romans 3:23

Things are so bad, anything we do to try to make it better only makes it worse. God understands we're trapped, without hope, incapable of even honestly asking Him for help. So God made an awesome sacrifice for us, sending His Son Jesus to rescue us. *“God demonstrates His own love towards us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.”*—Romans 5:8

Jesus came to rescue the entire world by dying on the cross and coming back to life. He offers you a chance to live in Him and to grow in His Spirit. As a part of His community on Earth, you can be a part of His people reaching out to a world in pain and offer help and love.

Follow Jesus now. To start, you don't “friend” Him on Facebook or sign a petition. In that book called Romans, we're told *“That if you confess with your mouth, ‘Jesus is Lord,’ and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved”* —Romans 10:9-10

You can use this prayer to express your faith in Him:

Dear God,

I realize that I am a mess and can't save myself. I choose to abandon my sin and turn my life over to You. I ask Jesus Christ to forgive me and become my Lord and Rescuer. I believe that Jesus died for me and rose from the dead. Come into my life and change me forever. Amen.
